We will have our traditional Ash Wednesday service at 7pm, but we are also trying something different this year. During the day from 8am until 7pm, we will offer the Self Imposition of Ashes. There will be someone at the Welcome desk to guide you. Come into the chapel and you will find ashes, "suggested" prayers and the words to say as you make the sign of the cross on your forehead. Stay for a moment in prayer, listen to the music and connect with God. Stop by on the way to work or school or during your lunch hour.

A NOTE FROM OUTREACH...

Let's look at the December numbers. The Christmas offering goal was \$5,500, and we received \$6,237.50. Fantastic! 41 food baskets went to The Baldwin Center. 37 gifts for 4 families and \$725 in gift cards went to Auburn Elementary School families. Gift cards, clothes, personal care items, toys, and infant items worth over \$2,000 went to Lighthouse in Pontiac. Much thanks for being so generous!

We intend to volunteer monthly at the Lighthouse Food Pantry and make lunches March 17-23. We continue weekly to deliver food from Starbucks to food pantries. We will invite you to be a friend of Outreach and and help out as we announce those projects. Blanket Sunday is February 25. \$10 buys a Church World Service blanket for someone who is suffering from a disaster like a hurricane, flood, or tornado. We invite you to pin a \$10 or \$20 dollar bill on our blanket that will hang by the Welcome Table.

Church World Service, which is the parent of our CROP Walks, has been operating since the end of the Second World War. It distributes tens of thousands of blankets annually. God bless you for whatever you feel called to do on February 25 as we continue this treasured tradition.

Advocacy Day for United Methodists is March 13 at the Michigan State Capital. We will be supporting mental health care access.


