

Dear Friends,

We launch into October with our Generosity Campaign: It's Time.

Jesus talked a lot about time. "... the time has come, now is the time... in this time..." The word "time" is mentioned in 212 places in the New Testament.

You know that the writers of the New Testament spoke Aramaic, but they wrote the scriptures in Greek. The Greeks had two words for time... the first is Chronos that is chronological time. (Our worship service is at 10 am.) This tick tick tick passing of time is Chronos and that accounts for more than 50 places in the New Testament. The predominate word for time used in the New Testament is Kairos. It is a moment in time, a perfect moment in time. The word gets its roots from archery. It is that moment when the archer finds the perfect opening to shoot the arrow and hit the target. That is where I believe we are at Troy First. We are in this important and special moment in time. We are poised to do amazing things in the community and in God's kingdom. But, to set us in the right direction it is also the perfect time for us to examine just where we are, how we live and how we give. We are going to spend a few weeks exploring where we are as a church and as individuals and where we want to be headed.

I met with our Generosity Campaign team last night. (Led by Chris DeVilling, with Betty Kalvoda, Traci Elliott, Rob Jewel, and Jeff Olesen.) The team has put together a campaign that will be inspiring, challenging and just plain fun. The fun starts on October 22 with the Community Bonfire. (We are a church, generous in spirit in the community.) We will have special music at this year's Bonfire, Erica and Jason. They sang at our outdoor worship service in July and I'm so excited they are coming back to be with us. Mark your calendar because you don't want to miss this event. Then on November 5 as we celebrate All Saints Day, we will have a special dinner to celebrate the life of Diane Martin, to honor the incredibly generous gift she has given our church and to look at how we all might participate in the endowment started with her gift. The dinner is November 5 th . Be sure to sign up and save your spot. (Look for a sign-up sheet at the welcome desk)

It is indeed a busy time, a challenging time, and a beautiful time. It is OUR TIME. Let's make the most of it together.
